



Ex-deputy gets jail for sexual assault

Waukesha — A retired Waukesha County Sheriff's Department deputy was sentenced Friday to 31 months in jail for sexually assaulting a boy and a girl between July 1, 1997, and September 1, 2008.

Terrence L. Greenwald, 56, of Summit was charged with seven counts of first-degree sexual assault, three counts of second-degree sexual assault, eight counts of child enticement and one count of causing a child age 13 to 18 to view sexual activity. All the charges are felonies, but in a plea deal, the charges were reduced to misdemeanors. He was also ordered to six years' probation.

Greenwald retired from the Sheriff's Department in December 2007.

According to the complaint filed in Waukesha County Circuit Court, the incidents involved Greenwald committing sexual acts individually with a boy and a girl. The girl told authorities that the first incident involving her that she could recall occurred when she was a first-grader in 1998. The last incident occurred in fall 2008, the complaint says. All of the sexual assault charges involve indecent touching, according to the complaint.

Greenwald exposed himself to the boy in July 1997, when the boy was about 8, and Greenwald caused the boy to view sexual activity in May 2004, the complaint says.

The matter was tried and prosecuted in Jefferson County to avoid any conflict of interest.
