Former Quitman sheriff hopeful faces child molestation charge

Two women – one a recent candidate for Quitman County sheriff – were indicted this week by a Quitman County grand jury on child molestation charges.

Joanna Harris, 40, and Angle Gregors, 34, turned themselves into to the Quitman County Sheriff's Office on arrest warrants after being indicted, according to a press release from Sheriff Steve Newton. Harris is a former deputy with the Randolph County Sheriff's Department and Gregors is a Randolph County EMT. Harris unsuccessfully ran for sheriff this year.

Newton stated in the release that both Harris and Gregors were indicted on charges of child molestation and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Their bonds were each set at \$20,000.

"The indictments were the result of a GBI investigation. The two ladies were arrested and booked at the Quitman County Sheriff's Office and released on bond pending trial," Newton stated.
